## **BACKGROUND**

To bring awareness to this very serious public health concern and prevent fatalities due to opioid overdose, the Ocean County Health Department, in collaboration with various community stakeholders, have developed the Ocean County Overdose Response Plan. Through the implementation of various prevention strategies, the overarching goal of the Ocean County Overdose Response Plan is to wrap support around those with substance use disorder to prevent and reduce overdose fatalities and save lives.

Currently, on average, we experience 5 fatal/nonfatal overdoses daily. After reviewing data from 2023, an increase in overdoses occurring outside of the residence was confirmed. This means that the places we shop, eat, enjoy entertainment, and recreate at could be a place where we may encounter such an emergency ( i.e. grocery stores, restaurants, concert venues, and parks).

The Summer Spike Strategy Toolkit will include actionable items for various public entities to implement at their respective location such as: performing frequent checks of public restrooms, the availability and accessibility of Narcan along with proper training and education, media campaigns to raise awareness, providing local bars, restaurants and convenience stores with information and resources relating to overdose and substance use.

#### **KNOW THE FACTS!**

The most common things that people are a<mark>fraid of before booking a training are-</mark>

#### -Am I liable for keeping and using Narcan at my business?

NO- the Overdose Prevention Act protects you when acting in good faith that you are trying to help someone who you think is experiencing an overdose

#### -Am I mandated to use it if I have Narcan onsite?

NO- if you are unsure, uncomfortable, or unsafe, call 911 and monitor the person

#### -Can I hurt someone with Narcan if it's not an opioid overdose?

NO- if there are no opioids in the persons body, Narcan will leave the system shortly

There is no minimum or maximum amount of people for a training session- we can train 1 person or 50 people!



## TAKE ACTION WITH US! GET NARCAN!

Narcan or naloxone is a life-saving nasal spray that can reverse an overdose from prescription opioids—including Vicodine, OxyContin, Percocet, and Codeine, as well as substances such as Heroin and Fentanyl when given in time. Overdose can happen anywhere, be prepared!



# Did You Know...

that under the Good Samaritan Law, you are protected from liability when administering Naloxone/Narcan in good faith?



# **Good Samaritan Law**

According to the New Jersey Department of Law & Public Safety (2023), "The Overdose Prevention Act or "Good Samaritan" law provides witnesses who seek emergency help in overdose emergencies with immunity from arrest and prosecution. A person who in good faith seeks medical assistance (calling 911) for someone experiencing an overdose may not be arrested, charged, prosecuted or convicted for possession or use of drugs or drug paraphernalia. The person who experiences a drug overdose and is the subject of a request for medical assistance is also provided with immunity from arrest and prosecution.

"If you administer naloxone to someone you believe is having an overdose, you will not be liable. If you administer naloxone in an emergency when you believe that another person is experiencing an opioid overdose, you will not be subject to any criminal or civil liability. When you obtain naloxone, be sure to review the patient overdose information provided by your pharmacist."

## **MOTELS/HOTELS/AIR BNB**



# Overdoses commonly occur in hotel/motel rooms. Here's how you can be prepared:

- Stock Narcan in hotel/motel/Air Bnb bathrooms and advertise with amenities information
- Provide OCHD Substance Use Resource Directories and recovery service materials to each patron/family at check-in
- Train hotel/motel staff and Air BnB property managers in Narcan administration
- Hang educational flyers in each hotel/motel room or Air BnB displaying the signs of overdose
- Place phone number for "Never Use Alone" by room telephones 800-484-3731 for English | 800-928-5330 for Spanish
- If medications are left behind, dispose of them safely by using police department prescription drop box locations, or a DeTerra pouch. Contact the OCHD for a list of locations or more information! 732-341-9700 Ext: 7233



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
